

Our History

Salem was built in 1893 by a handful of Swedish immigrants who needed a place of worship. The dirt-poor immigrants had been walking nearly six miles every Sunday morning to an established Lutheran Church. At times they took food for their meal, and walked 6 miles back home. The few immigrants somehow raised \$500 and built the Chapel over a hundred years ago. Salem has grown a lot in the last years. We have gone through a building project which increased the size of the facility and gave us more space for youth gatherings and adult meetings. We now have indoor plumbing facilities, even though we did retain the outside privy as a monument to Salem's heritage.



Our kitchen facilities have been modernized and we have a lovely narthex. Our altar now features a beautiful stained glass window, reconditioned pulpit and repaired communion rail.
